

RELIGIOUS WORKER VISA

As you know, our international priests arrive on a nonimmigrant religious worker (R-1) visa status that allows a five-year period of work in the United States. To remain in the U.S. longer, they, like many others, need to transition to immigrant-status Legal Permanent Residence (LPR). In April 2023, the U.S. Department of State changed its interpretation of the law so that Special Immigrant Juveniles (SIJ), and religious workers are classified in the same category (EB-4 visa category) and both are subject to the same annual, limited cap on visas issued. The practical impact of this change is that it is now impossible for an R-1. visa holder to adjust to LPR within the maximum time of their five-year stay, and those international priests will have to leave the United States prematurely and unnecessarily. (Fortunately, this does not affect Father Michael!) This would have a serious detrimental impact not only on the Diocese of Madison, but dioceses and religious order throughout the United States, and most other non-Catholic religious organizations. It is contrary to Congress' intent when creating the Religious Worker Visa Program.

Efforts at seeking executive branch relief have been unsuccessful, so we urgently turn to the legislative branch of government and need your help. There is a USCCB Action Alert at https://www.votervoice.net/USCCB/ Campaigns/106744/Respond,

AMEN

The word Amen is one of a small number of Hebrew words which have been imported unchanged into the liturgy of the Church. This word is attributed to our Lord in the Gospel of Saint Matthew some twenty-eight times, as well as in the Gospel of Saint John as a double formed, "Amen, Amen, I say to you," some twenty-six times. As regards the etymology, Amen is a derivative from the Hebrew verb amen "to strengthen" or "confirm."

In the Holy Scripture it appears almost invariably as an adverb, and its primary use is to indicate that the speaker adopts for his own what has already been said by another. The familiarity of the usage of saying Amen at the end of all prayers, even before the Christian era, is evidenced by Tobit 9:12.

A second use of Amen, that which is most common in the New Testament, but not quite unknown in the Old, has no reference to the words of any other person, but is simply a form of affirmation or confirmation of the speaker's own thought, sometimes introducing it, sometimes following it, such as when Jesus says, "Amen, Amen, I say to you . . . "

Lastly, the common practice of concluding any discourse or chapter of a subject with a doxology ending in Amen seems to have led to a third distinctive use of the word in which it appears as nothing more than a formula of conclusion.

FOURTH SUNDAY

OF EASTER

- Father John Muir Recently I was with my little dog Libby at a retreat center in the Arizona

desert. I sat in a chair near a ravine filled with shrubs. Unbeknownst to me, Libby wandered down there and disappeared. Suddenly an animal's wild shriek erupted from the area. Without thinking, I bolted down into the ravine fully expecting to see coyotes, javelinas, or rattlesnakes. I did not care. I desperately wanted to get Libby out of there, without any self-regard. Before I could face whatever danger lay hidden, my dog blissfully trotted out from an entirely different area, utterly unaware that I had (quite heroically) just placed my life on the line.

When the adrenaline wore off, I thought to myself: how far would I have been willing to go to save her? I do not know. But I do know, if I had literally died, my friends and family would have certainly thought me insane for dying for a dog. No offense, Libby.

How passionately Jesus wants us to know him and his willingness to die for us! This week he says, "I know my own and my own know me," and "I lay down my life for the sheep." Here we encounter an insanely excessive love for us. Christianity is a relationship and not simply a religion or ethical code. In Jesus, God rescues and saves us. He laid down his life for you and me - and he has taken it up again. So often we are like Libby - blissfully ignorant of the reality of both our spiritual danger and his saving love. This Easter season, the Risen Jesus calls us to be more conscious than ever before about his love. He never ceases to lay down his life for us.
