## Shared Quest Deepens Faith and Friendships

Saint Dennis Parish and Belize have shared a special connection over the past few years that has been solidified through mission trips, fundraising events and friendships made. This summer, the mission group from Saint Dennis put on an amazing Cave Quest Vacation Bible School for the students at Saint Joseph's in Belize. Students were transported to a world of caves and spelunking, all while seeing how Jesus is truly the "Light of the World." Much collaboration was done between our Faith Formation leaders and the Belize team to come up with activities, crafts and songs to bring to Belize. The result was a hands-on, faith building experience that was truly enjoyed by the



Belizean children. The personal connections that were made between the children and our Belize team were life-changing.

Two months later, on August 7 - 9, we ran our very own version of Cave Quest Vacation Bible School here at Saint Dennis. Twenty-five middle and high school students stepped up to be counselors (Cave Crew) and went to training sessions throughout the summer so they could be prepared. These young leaders inspired and connected with our participants as they learned about Jesus and his importance in our lives. Several members of the Belize team shared their expertise and donated their time to run stations and prepare materials for this spelunking adventure. Their help was invaluable! Over the next four years of study, Cristian will continue to spend his breaks here at Saint Dennis, giving our parish the opportunity to provide support and shelter as he continues to prepare for the priesthood. While he jokes that his primary duty here at Saint Dennis is to rest, he has enjoyed helping with tasks around the parish, serving Mass and visiting with students at the school. This summer, he spent time working on his cooking and driving skills and played a little guitar for fun. He also participated in the mission trip to Belize.

He was touched by the people of Belize, but, more importantly, by the new relationships he formed with his fellow missionaries from Saint Dennis, making his return to Wisconsin a true homecoming as he settles in to share in the life of our community for years to come.

## Capital Recommendations to be Shared October 29

A Sanctuary Remodel and Campus Improvements Committee kick-off meeting took place July 9 with Groth Design Group architect and designer Paul Barribeau, who led a group discussion about the Saint Dennis sanctuary design phase and other proposed campus improvements.

The centerpiece of the church sanctuary redesign and remodel is the moving of the tabernacle from our Blessed Sacrament Chapel to a place of prominence in our church. Along with the tabernacle relocation, the sanctuary platform will be reconfigured to allow for the centering of an immovable altar. This redesign brings the tabernacle, altar and baptismal font in-line with each other, reflecting the Bishop’s directive that “Christ’s dwelling place be front and center in all churches, to add emphasis to the Lord’s presence in the Eucharist.”

The committee has also suggested a reworking of the choir space, a redesign of the reredos (or back wall) and replacement of the nave lighting. Other church and campus improvements could include: updated church bathrooms, new church flooring, including the gathering space. Among many needed items are new air conditioning equipment for the school gym and handicap access doors to the Parish Center.

A design presentation to the congregation is planned for October 29 after the 10:45 am Mass.

As pastor, I give thanks to God for your generosity this past year and am confident in your investment in the future of Saint Dennis. I am pleased to offer the following observations:

## Summary Statements

- The greatest source of parish income is through envelope offerings. Our envelope contributions have maintained a constant level from previous years.

- Our parish and school expenses have seen a slight increase over the past fiscal year and thus at year's end we had a deficit of \$42,618 (2% of our overall income).

- Our giving beyond the regular envelope and offertory to various parish initiatives and diocesan appeals exceeded \$380,000. This is GOOD NEWS!

# The Empowering Gift of a Saint Dennis Catholic Education

There's power in Catholic education – the power of truth, the power of impact, and the power to make the world a better place. And there's power in preserving it through our Catholic Educational Endowment.

## **What is the Saint Dennis Catholic Educational Endowment?**

The Saint Dennis Catholic Educational Endowment was established in 1989 to support operations of Saint Dennis Catholic School and the parish's religious education programs. Today, the fund is housed within the Catholic Diocese of Madison Foundation, Inc. (CDMF) and exceeds \$750,000 in principal.

The principal, which is never spent, is invested and yields interest earnings each year that are distributed according to the mission. At the end of 2016, more than \$33,000 was available for Saint Dennis education. The larger the principal, the more earnings that can be generated. The fund is a sound way to support Catholic education into the future.

## **How can it grow?**

Awareness of, and commitment to, our Catholic Educational Endowment Fund is the best hope for a strong future. Please consider how you can contribute both now and in the future. A number of flexible options exist:

- A special endowment envelope is included in the parish's monthly envelope packets every February and August.

- Your will or other estate plans provide options to direct an amount or percentage of your estate to the "Saint Dennis Educational Endowment Fund."
- Required minimum distributions (RMD) from retirement funds offer tax benefits when you designate your distribution to the "Saint Dennis Educational Endowment Fund."

## **The Power to Make It Personal with Sponsor-A-Student Scholarship Program**

Circumstances can get in the way of a Catholic education. It is our goal to remove the roadblock of finances, both for families who think they cannot afford Saint Dennis and for families who experience a sudden hardship.

In 2016-17 alone, the Saint Dennis Sponsor-A-Student Scholarship Program provided aid to more than 30 families in need. Since the program's inception in 2007, more than \$200,000 of generous support from parishioners and outside grants has benefited our students and strengthened our parish. This is an annual income and expense account that supports a real student in real time, today. The program supplements distributions from the Catholic Endowment Fund. ## SCRIP Makes Giving Easy

You go to the grocery store at least once a week right? The car needs gas, kids need school supplies, spring clean up and gardening are happening plus there is always a birthday, holiday, graduation or wedding that needs a gift. All of these items have a scrip card available! Not familiar with scrip? Never heard of it? Scrip is a gift card program where you buy cards at their full value and a percentage of your purchase is paid to Home and School and one of several parish program areas: Faith Formation, Building and Grounds or School. School families can designate their rebates to help pay their tuition.

How do these rebates work? Let's say you buy a \$100 Woodman's card. It costs \$100 and you get \$100 in food or gas. The Woodman's rebate is 5%. Saint Dennis Home and School gets \$2.50 and the program you designate gets \$2.50. Last year, Saint Dennis School raised over \$20,000 in rebates!

Scrip can be purchased online, in the school or parish offices or once a month after Masses in Fellowship Hall. Interested in learning more about scrip? ## Great Beginnings

The installation of 66 solar panels on the Festival storage garages is complete. The solar panels are connected to the electrical grid and generating electricity. The panels will generate up to 29 megawatt hours (MWh) per year of pollution-free electricity and as much as 839 MWh over their 30-year lifespan.

Using the savings to purchase wind power will reduce Saint Dennis' total carbon footprint by 37%. The Care for Creation Team is working on an online tracking system to monitor our parish electric production and consumption in real time.

The Team would like to assist parishioners in understanding their own energy usage. It is a simple process to calculate a carbon footprint and the Team can help parishioners dive in and make the calculations. The Team is eager to continue leading efforts to reduce the parish family's collective environmental footprint and to care for God's creation.

We gather before the meal for introductions, prayer and to receive our work assignments from dishwashing to serving food. The meal is served from 5:45 pm - 6:30 pm. The team of volunteers is encouraged to sit down and share the meal with the guests. By 7:00 pm clean up is completed and the Saint Dennis team packs it in, ready to do it all again the following month.
